### **Pupil Premium Funding**

We recently messaged you the link for online applications for free school meals. If you are eligible it is really important to apply because the school will be given up to 6 years of additional funding for your child. School budgets are increasingly stretched and we need every penny of funding in order to continue providing the best possible education for the children. Please apply for funding if you think you might be eligible – no paperwork is required and it's completely confidential. As we are a cashless school – receiving free school meals is also completely confidential for the children. Please support the school and apply for the funding if you think there is a chance you are eligible – we would be very grateful indeed.

### **Support we can offer you**



Our school nurse, Mel Dowling, is available for appointments and runs regular drop-ins. Just ask at the office if you'd like to see Mel (she is excellent). In addition, if you have any concerns about your child's learning, progress or emotional health and well-being our SENCO, Mrs Bowen, is here most Tuesdays and Fridays and can offer a range of help and support as well as arranging appointments wherever necessary. If you feel you need any help or support just let us know – come and see Mr Hinton or Mrs Chapman and we will do our best to arrange the best support we can.

### **Is everything OK?**

Does your child receive their homework and is it marked? Is your child's reading book changed regularly? Have you been treated with the care and dignity we pride ourselves on? We need to know! Little things can and do go wrong in school - the important thing is we will always try our best to sort them out. If something isn't right, if you are upset or if you just need a bit of help – contact the school straight away. You can contact the class teacher or if you have a more pressing problem you can always see Mr Hinton (Head teacher) or Mrs Chapman (Deputy Head teacher) Mrs Cheema is the senior teacher and Miss Wisniewski is the acting head of nursery and Reception. We are all here ready to help you.



### **Let's treat each other with respect**

It's very important that the school looks after families with the highest level of respect. We are very grateful to you for treating us with respect and care too. Even when you are upset about something – please remember we will do our best to sort it out for you. ## ParentView
