The Holy Season of LENT is here



During the season of Lent we are reminded of the time Jesus spent in the desert being tempted to make wrong choices and turn away from God the Father. Jesus kept his faith, stayed strong and did not give into temptation. He did this for 40 days and 40 nights. In solidarity with Christ we are asked to pray, fast and give alms during Lent and there will be every opportunity for the children to do this in school throughout Lent – for example at CAFOD Family Fast Day, by collecting sponsor money for the pancake flip, special activities such as drama, dancing and prayers during mission week and during Holy Week itself our series of special assemblies culminating with the Stations of the Cross. Throughout Lent the children also have the opportunity to pray the Stations of the Cross both in extra assemblies and in their own classrooms.

Prayer Bags

Over the course of the year, every child will receive a gift from the school which will be a little prayer bag. Year 4 and Year 5 will be receiving theirs this half term. The bags contain a small holding cross made from the wood of real Bethlehem Olive Trees, a battery operated candle, a cloth and a souvenir bookmark. We would like the children to use their prayer bag to create a display focus and hopefully say some prayers with their family.

Prayer is universal and part of all faiths so if you are not a Christian family please make use of the cloth and the candle – you are welcome to keep the wooden cross as a gift if you would like to or you can send it back to school if you prefer – but please keep the bag, cloth and candle and let your child use it to make a display as a focus for praying together. Our aim is to encourage and promote prayer at home amongst the children and families – and prayer is central to all faiths – not just Catholicism. Please accept the gift and make use of it.

Class Saint's Days



Every class in school has their own patron Saint. As a new initiative for this year we are allowing the children to wear their own clothes on their Saints days. To make it fair to everyone we have to do a bit of catching up as some classes have missed their Saint's days earlier in the academic year! Look out for a message about when your child's class are celebrating their Saint's day – and bear in mind that just between now and July – it might not match up with the official Saint's day if we are catching up! From next September the Saint's days will all match up closely! Thanks for your understanding!

Free School Meals – apply online and get precious extra funding for the school – no paperwork needed!

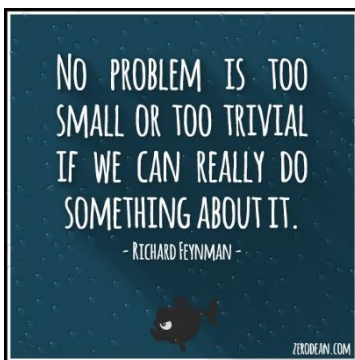
If you are eligible for free school meals it's so important that you register! Even if you don't take up the meal the school will receive precious extra funding for up to 6 years – all of which will be spent on providing the best education possible for the children.



Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 automatically all receive a free meal – but if you think you are eligible for free school meals funding – PLEASE go online and apply!
