Summer Term

Summer term is in full swing here at the school and there is lots happening. You should have received the diary dates for the term – please keep these as it lists lots of important dates between now and the end of term.

We are looking forward to working with you this term and look forward to seeing you in the coming weeks.



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Mission Awards for Years 1 to 6

On Monday we are launching a new awards scheme that is suitable for children from all faith backgrounds. The 'mission awards' scheme is a set of achievements for each year group linked to our school's mission statement. A copy of the achievements for your child's year group is attached to this letter. If your child wishes to apply for the 'mission award' for their year group they can do so at any point in the school year. There is an application deadline every half term. If your child successfully meets the standards they will be awarded the mission award medal for their year group in an awards assembly. They can apply for the mission award for their year group up to 2 times per term but they can only collect one medal per year – in other words – once they have successfully met the standard for their year group they will receive the medal and can next apply for a mission award in their next year group when they move up classes. Mission Award medals are available for Year 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6. The standard required for each medal becomes a bit more challenging as the year groups get increasingly higher.

It's easy for the children to apply for their mission award medal. Every half term the mission team (a group of children together with Mrs Chapman) meet to review the applications and either agree that each applicant has met the standard or provide help with any areas that need additional work. Medals will only be awarded where the standards are clearly met.

Kind hands, kind words...like Jesus

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All the children need to do is bring in some evidence of how they meet the standards. An adult can prepare this for them – they don't have to write it out themselves (though we hope the older children will prepare some of their own applications) The evidence can be from school e.g. 'I have written my own prayers in my RE book on 1st December' or it might be from home e.g. 'I have helped my mum and dad at home by tidying up the garden' – together with some confirmation from the parent e.g. a sentence to confirm. The children might like to include photographs or supporting statements e.g. thank you cards from people they have helped, photos of the good deeds they have done.

We have launched the mission awards as an incentive for children to think deeply about the school's mission. Our mission is to 'work, learn and grow together guided by Jesus' teachings' and is relevant to children from all faith backgrounds. Where reference is made to prayer, for example, prayers from all faith traditions are relevant. You will notice that most of the standards relate to being a good and kind person – something which is important in ALL world religions.



Preparing an application for a mission award should be enjoyable. It doesn't need to be lengthy or wordy – it just needs a little bit of time spent chatting and preparing a few words to explain how the children meet the standard for each year group. Achieving a Mission Award Medal is a fine achievement to be proud of – it affirms good citizenship, an understanding of the importance of faith and a commitment to the school's values of truth, forgiveness, respect, equality and kindness.

We hope the mission awards will be very popular and we have lots of lovely gold medals waiting for successful applicants.

The first deadline for the mission awards is Monday 21st May with medals for successful applicants on Friday 25th May. The next one will be Monday 16th July with medals awarded on Friday 20th July. Please bear in mind that as it is an awards scheme – simply applying does not mean the medal will be awarded. There must be clear evidence for each standard before we can award the medal. The evidence doesn't need to be lengthy or wordy but needs to be genuine and honest.

Holidays in term time

We do not authorise holidays during term time. In line with legislation, we refer unauthorised absence to the Education Investigation Service who have the power to issue penalty fines and in some cases, prosecutions. Our attendance policy and a link to the government legislation is on our website. Please do not be offended because a request for holiday is refused – it is our clear policy and has been for several years – it is not fair to make exceptions and we are only complying with the law of the land. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.



Thank you for your support with school uniform and appearance

Thank you for ensuring your child follows our uniform policy. Before the holidays we sent a request about strings and strands of hair obscuring children's faces – you were all very quick to address the matter and that's very much appreciated. Thank you for your support. The uniform policy is on the website and we really appreciate your support. Thank you very much for your help.

Free School Meals

If you are eligible for free school meals at any point it is really important to apply. Not only could you save money and provide your child with a delicious school meal (our catering now comes from Bishop Milner and is of an excellent standard!) but you could help the school to access thousands of pounds worth of extra funding for the children. It's quick, easy and confidential to apply – your child can still bring a packed lunch if they prefer. The extra funding is very valuable to the school and every penny gets spent on the children. ANYONE who is eligible should apply – including families in RECEPTION, YEAR 1 and YEAR 2. Please support the school and help us to increase our funding if you can. Details of how to apply are enclosed.

The new meals and new menus have been massively popular. Every day there's a hot main course to choose from or a filled jacket potato, sandwich grab bag and a pasta dish to enjoy. If your child is in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2 they can have this delicious food FREE EVERY DAY! A choice of sandwiches is available every day and all dietary needs can be met.
