My child is happy at this school	97%	3%	We want EVERY child to feel happy at school and do our best to ensure that this happens. In the children's survey, children told us that they were happy at school.
My child feels safe at this school	97%	3%	We want EVERY child to feel safe at school and do our best to ensure that this happens. In the children's survey, children told us that they felt safe at school.
The school makes sure its pupils are well behaved	93%	7%	We have a very robust behaviour policy which is consistently used from Nursery through to Year 6 – including on the playground. This is regularly shared with the children. Please see the behaviour policy on our website for more details.
My child's unique achievements are recognised and valued by the school	93%	7%	We are proud to celebrate the unique achievements of every child. During Prayer and Merit gatherings on Friday morning children are encouraged to bring in celebrations form home to share with our whole school family.
The school deals with any bullying and harassment quickly and effectively	93%	7%	We have two annual anti-bullying, anti-racism and internet safety weeks – (one more than is celebrated nationally). We recognise that any issues around bullying can be very complex and have to be addressed to give all parties the opportunity to discuss issues and we support all children in finding effective resolutions. It is not the case that we can simply exclude or suspend a pupil without giving them the opportunity to put things right – we offer great support in doing this. The school makes me aware of what my child will learn during the year	97%	3%	During the school year we have three parents' evenings and the half-term where there isn't a parents' evening we send out either a mini report or a full written report to keep parents informed about their child. Each term the class teacher sends out a newsletter to inform parents of the topics being taught during that term – these are also on our school website.
Any concerns that are raised with the school are dealt with properly	97%	3%	We understand that sometimes things can go wrong. When they do we always try our best to resolve them quickly. Every newsletter reminds parents to contact the school if they have any worries – no matter how small.
My Child has special educational needs or a disability and the school gives them the support they need to succeed (IF YOUR CHILD DOES NOT HAVE SPECIAL EDUCATIONAL NEEDS OR A DISABILITY PLEASE TICK NOT APPLICABLE)	92%	8%	Miss Oakley and, during her Maternity leave, Mrs Hickman work with many external agencies to ensure that all of our children with special educational needs are well supported – this includes working with: CAHMS, Educational Psychologists, Physiotherapists, Speech and Language professionals, incontinence specialists, Dudley SEND Team and various Case Officers.
The school provides good quality Catholic Religious Education for its pupils	100%	0%	As a Catholic School, through Canon Law, 10% of our teaching time is devoted to RE. RE is a lesson like no other and one the children tell us they enjoy immensely.
The school has high expectations for my child	90%	10%	We have high expectations for all children. Children have different starting points when they arrive in school and we do everything we can to help them achieve to the best of their ability.
My child does well at this school	97%	3%	Children at St Joseph's have always achieved highly and this year we have had our best SATs result EVER for our Year 6 children!
The school lets me know how my child is doing	100%	0%	We think this is so important – school and home working together is always best for the children.
There is a good range of subjects available to my child at this school	97%	3%	We teach all of the subjects dictated by the National Curriculum and do our best to offer exciting, interesting and well-resourced lessons to engage pupils!

The school fulfils its mission to make Christ known today	97%	3%	Jesus Christ is at the centre of everything we do. Our school policies are rooted in the teachings of Christ, we gather together as a school family to pray and worship together at least three times each week. Our school values and Mission Statement are at the very heart of all our interactions.
My child is able to take part in meaningful and enjoyable Catholic assemblies, masses, prayer gatherings and other acts of collective worship	93%	7%	Each week we have: Whole School Prayer and Liturgy – sharing Sunday's Gospel, Whole School Mass – led by a different class each week, Merit and Prayer assemblies – where children take part in two class assemblies each year, children hold prayer partner gatherings with their prayer partners twice each term, children take it in turns to lead whole class Liturgy each week for their peers. In addition to this, before each pupil group meeting, children take the opportunity to pray together. We also have an indoor and outdoor prayer area which children can access for their own quiet prayer and reflection. We teach the children to pray in different ways: silently, spontaneously and teach a wide variety of traditional prayers in each class.
The school supports my child's wider personal development	93%	7%	We offer many clubs, lunchtime clubs, pupil groups (Mission Team, Creation Guardians, SAS, School Council, Mini Vinnies) trips, competitive sporting events, experiences such as theatre groups, MP visits etc to ensure that we give the children a wide range of different experiences.
The Catholic Life of the school enables my child to make a positive contribution to the community inspired by the example of Jesus Christ e.g. by helping and serving others, charitable activity, being a valuable part of the community	93%	7%	Each class has chosen a charity to support for the year, we take part in many CAFOD online assemblies, CAFOD Fast Days, CAFOD charity events – such as Walk for Hunger, our pupil groups are very active visiting the food bank to take our donations, we have special Discipleship Weeks where we share Pope Francis' Encyclicals of Fratelli Tutti and Laudato Si and this year we were only the 8 th school in the Archdiocese of Birmingham to achieve CAFOD's Live Simply Award. Children are given the opportunity to apply to receive our school's mission award each term too.
The school offers a wide range of activities in addition to the curriculum e.g. lunchtime activities, after school clubs, sports, music or arts activities in addition to subject lessons.	93%	7%	We offer a wide range of lunchtime clubs and afterschool clubs for the children to take part in, we work with Dudley Performing Arts to provide all of the children with access to high quality musical experiences too.
I would recommend the school to another parent	97%	3%	We do our very best to ensure that every child is as happy and safe as possible. St Joseph's is very over-subscribed with many children on the waiting list for each class and this year we have 117 applications for our 30-place reception class.
