#### **Inspections**



We were so very proud to share our CSI (Catholic School Inspection) Report with you prior to the Christmas break-OUTSTANDING in all areas of the Inspection Framework. Our last inspection was 2018 under different framework and different criteria so we are very pleased and proud that we have been able to once again be awarded the highest judgements in all areas.

The first week back at school was certainly busy too with our OFSTED Inspection. 2015 was our last OFSTED Inspection under a different framework and again with different grading criteria. The overall judgement for schools has now been taken away and schools are judged in the specific areas of Leadership and Management, Personal Development, Behaviour and Attitudes, EYFS and Quality of Education. We are not yet permitted to share the outcome with parents, but we are very pleased and look forward to sharing the full report when we are given permission by OFSTED to do so.

#### <u>Jubilee Year – Pilgrims of Hope</u>



Pope Francis has decreed that 2025 will be a year of Jubilee, a holy year which happens every 25 years in the Catholic Church.

This Jubilee Year 2025 will be centred on the theme "Pilgrims of Hope". It is marked by the opening of the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica in the Vatican. The Holy Father officially opened the Holy Year with the rite of the Opening of the Holy Door of the Basilica of St. Peter on 24/12/24 and it will be finished on Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> January 2026. The door stands for Jesus;

whoever enters through that door will be saved. In this Jubilee Year, our Pope Francis, after opening the Holy Door, was the first entering through that door. He invites all of us, the pilgrims of Hope, entering through that door, so that we may enter into God's life to share God's salvation.

In school we have created our own special doors – at the front of the school, leading to KS1 playground and KS2 playground – we ask that all who walk through them allow Jesus to enter into their hearts.

We are also planning special visits to religious places during this special year so that we can become pilgrims too.

#### **Smart Watches**

For safeguarding purposes we need to ask that children do not bring smart watches into school. There have been cases in other schools where children have used smart watches to take inappropriate photos. For this reason and following advice from safeguarding agencies we need to ask for parental support in telling children not to bring these watches into school. Mobile phones are currently handed into the school office in the morning and collected after school to keep children safe, smart watches if worn to school can also be handed into the school office where they will be kept safe until the end of the day. #### Please support us in maintaining our high uniform standards

Please ensure that children come to school in the correct uniform. Earrings (even covered with plasters), trainers, hair shavings and leggings with skirts are not allowed. Please see the uniform guide below taken from our school website.

#### **Boys**

Royal Blue St Joseph's pique polo shirt: either plain Royal Blue jumper or Royal Blue St Joseph's sweatshirt: grey trousers. Sensible black shoes

Summer Alternative: Knee length grey shorts, sensible shoes (no flipflop sandals)

#### Girls

Royal Blue St Joseph's pique polo shirt: either plain Royal Blue jumper or Royal Blue St Joseph's sweat-shirt: grey skirt/grey uniform trousers. Sensible black shoes.

Summer Alternative: Blue Gingham dress: either plain Royal Blue jumper/cardigan or Royal Blue St Joseph's sweatshirt, OR knee length grey shorts. Sensible, flat-heel shoes. (no flip-flop sandals)

### PE Kit

All children should have: Plain black shorts: a plain white T-shirt and a pair of pumps: all kept in a PE bag.

Children are welcome to bring tracksuit bottoms and tracksuit tops for outdoor PE during the cooler weather. Trainers, boots or fashion shoes are not allowed.

#### Hair styles

Hair shaving and sculpting (e.g. tram lines, ticks and other shavings) are not allowed. Hairstyles must be smart and neat. Use of gels or styling products should be minimal. For safety reasons all long hair (boys and girls) must be tied back at all times. Highlights, dyeing and colouring of hair is not allowed.

Nail varnish is not allowed.

#### Jewellery

As a safety precaution and to prevent accidents during PE and other activities, the wearing of any item of jewellery in Nursery or Main School is strictly forbidden without exception.

#### St Francis' Forest



If you follow us on social media you may have seen the development of St Francis' Forest. This is an outdoor area which we have been developing for outdoor learning. Soon we will be installing a digital weather station, wildlife cameras, bird watching tents and an observation station! We have purchased class sets of boots so we'll do our best to keep the children mud free! During this term we are also hoping to have a

pond installed to give children the opportunity to go pond dipping and look at pond life.

#### **Wrap Around Care**

We have been working with Beechwood Primary School (the school across the road) to provide wraparound care for the families of St Joseph's. We have been looking at ways we can work together so that our families have access to high quality breakfast and after school care. We are very much hoping that this is something that can be launched after ½ term. Beechwood are hosting an open afternoon on **Monday 27th January**, where perspective parents can go and have a tour of the school and see the staff and the provision between 3:15pm -3:45pm. This is a great opportunity to see the facilities and look at what they have to offer!

#### **Attendance and Punctuality**

Any one of us can be running late from time to time for good reasons – but children must ordinarily arrive at school at the correct start time – and as per school registration rules – they will be marked late if they arrive after the start time. We reserve the right to unauthorize persistent lateness and this will be recorded as unauthorised absence which can ultimately lead to intervention from the Education Investigation Service and possible penalties. Please support regular attendance and regular good timekeeping. The Children's Commissioner has produced some excellent resources related to attendance which we will be sharing in

school. One important point to note from the Children's Commissioner is that – 'if you miss 30 minutes of school a day this amounts to 19 days lost each year.'

Details of the meeting for parents will follow in due course.
