- Please ensure uniform items are clearly labelled (jumpers and cardigans especially) this will help locate any missing clothing items quickly.
- Reception children will be sent home every Friday with their Homework bags and their Home School Link Book. These will need to be school for the following Wednesday.
- Nursery children will take their Home School Link book home every Friday to be bought back to school the following week.

What are we learning about?

This half term our topic is In the Garden and after May half term our topic is Under the Sea. Some the stories we will be sharing are The Tiny Seed, Superworm, Grandpa's Garden, Sharing a Shell, Commotion in the Ocean and Mister Seahorse.

In RE, both Nursery and Reception will be focusing on Easter, Pentecost, People who help us, Prayer, God's Family, Special Celebrations.

Maths

Nursery — exploring and applying numbers, writing numbers, shapes (2D and 3D) and positional language.

Reception — We have started to follow the Busy Ants Maths Scheme — used by the rest of the school alongside our Number Sense lessons. This term we will be looking at adding and subtracting, counting in 2's, 5's and 10's, doubling and halving, grouping and sharing and money.

Literacy

Nursery — identifying parts of the book, looking at different signs and symbols, recognising initial sounds and begin to make marks to show letters in their name.

Reception - continuing to develop our phonics awareness through our Read Write Inc (RWI) programme. We are looking at sequencing narrative texts, looking at describing settings and developing our sentence writing thinking about finger spaces and capital letters.

Values for Spring Term:

Eloquent and Truthful — before half term
