I hope you have had a happy, restful and fun-filled Christmas and New Year! I'm looking forward to this term with the children. Homework will be given out on a Friday which will be due back in by the following Thursday. English Homework will be given out in books and Maths Homework will be on a sheet.

Children will also have weekly spellings from their phonics groups — please bring spelling books to school every Monday. As always, if there are any queries about anything, please do not hesitate to come and see us.
