What are we learning about?

This half term we are focusing on nursery rhymes and 'all about me'. We will also be focusing on a wide range of story books to develop speaking, listening and language skills.

In RE, we are going to be focusing on the Creation story, looking at the things God created and how to look after our world.

In Maths, we are focusing on number. We are learning to count, understanding quantities and recognise numbers.

In Literacy, we are going to explore a wide range of nursery rhymes and stories to develop children's knowledge and understanding. The children will also experience different mark making opportunities.
